**MINUTES OF THE 06/10/2003
REGULAR BOARD MEETING**

Chairman George Walski called the meeting to order at 6:35 p.m. All Board Members were present.

Open meeting certification laws were met. Gerald Stellpflug called for a motion to adopt the agenda. David Prondzinski seconded and the motion carried.

There were no public comments.

Gerald Stellpflug moved to approve the minutes of the May 8, 2003 Board Meeting; David Prondzinski seconded and the motion carried.

Doris Dahl, Clerk/Treasurer reported a balance as of May 31, 2003 of \$290,612.73 in checking and \$62,000 in a Certificate of Deposit for a total of \$352,612.73.

David Prondzinski moved to transfer \$650.00 from the general fund to the other insurance account. Gerald Stellpflug seconded and the motion carried.

David Prondzinski made a motion to approve vouchers dated May 9, 2003 to June 10, 2003 for check numbers 12571 through 12611. Gerald Stellpflug seconded and the motion carried.

Building Permits:

Building Issues: The report for the water testing came back good. There is no need for an electric handicap door opener. A letter was written to Rhonda Hammond stating she would not be receiving her rent deposit back due to damages to the walls and the floors not being mopped.

David Prondzinski moved to add additional rules to the use of the Community Center - #18 No hard liquor allowed on premises; and #19 if damage to building exceeds deposit, the renter would be billed for additional charges. Gerald Stellpflug seconded and the motion carried.

David Prondzinski moved to purchase a new mower head. Gerald Stellpflug seconded and the motion carried.

In response to an ad placed in the La Crosse Area Builders newsletter for a building inspector, Bud Raymer of West Salem applied. He will be asked to come to the July board meeting to meet with the Board.

A bid from was received Burt Surveying in the amount of \$1600.00 to survey the Old Town Hall lot. It was tabled until next meeting.

The Clerk presented the liquor license applications. David Prondzinski moved to approve all, except that the Hungry Point application is approved conditional upon receipt of clearance from the Revenue Department. Gerald Stellpflug seconded and the motion carried.

David Prondzinski moved to approve operator license for Christopher Schwertel, Aaron Youngerberg, Ben Neumann, Kit McPhee, Raymond Harris, Erin Pecunies, Teri Speck, Amy Langer, Becky Ross, Misty Wedan, Casey Sonsalla, Cory Carter, Jon Tanner and Kathy Pozanc. Gerald Stellpflug seconded and the motion carried.

Correspondence: Several zoning letters were received from the County. The county nurses sent a letter to Beverly Locke giving her until July 18, 2003 to clean up her lot on Sullivan Road. Rick and Grace Glaunert's names were submitted for the Trempealeau Lions Citizen of the Year award. A letter was received from the Department of Revenue stating the Town's 2001 assessment is in compliance.

Dan Lilla informed the Board that the curling club is looking at putting in an energy saving roof in the rink area.

A concerned resident who lives on Swartling Road asked the Board if they could lower the speed limit on Schubert Road or have it policed for speeders. The Board will look into that.

The next board meeting is set for July 9, 2003 at 6:30 p.m. with a special town meeting at 7:30 p.m.

Gerald Stellpflug moved to adjourn at 7:55 p.m. David Prondzinski seconded and the motion carried.
