**MINUTES OF THE 2/09/2006  
REGULAR BOARD MEETING**

Chairman George Walski called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. All Board Members were present.

Open meeting certification laws were met. David Prondzinski moved to adopt the agenda, Gerald Stellflug seconded and the motion carried.

**Public Comments.** – None.

Gerald Stellflug moved to approve the minutes of the January 12, 2006 board meeting; David Prondzinski seconded and the motion carried.

Doris Dahl, Clerk/Treasurer reported a balance as of January 31, 2006 of \$741,801.31 in checking and \$69,941.05 in a regular savings account for a total of \$811,742.36.

Gerald Stellflug moved to make the construction loan payment now; David Prondzinski seconded and the motion carried. The original payment date is March 21.

After discussion, Gerald Stellflug moved to make the final \$1000 payment to Olympic Builders for the completion of the new town shop; David Prondzinski seconded and the motion carried.

The Board reviewed the vouchers for January 13, 2006 through February 9, 2006. Gerald Stellflug moved to pay the bills; David Prondzinski seconded and the motion carried.

**Building Permits**

Mrs. Bob Pomeroy presented a permit to build a new home on Lot 14, River Pine Road. Gerald Stellflug moved to approve; David Prondzinski seconded and the motion carried.

Roman & Joan Lilla presented a permit to rebuild a home on Stanislawski Lane. David Prondzinski moved to approve; Gerald Stellflug seconded and the motion carried.

Reed McRoberts, Trempealeau County Zoning, called and stated that part of Kay Estates Lane needed to be re-named. The following suggestions were made: Harter Lane, Nelson Lane, or Fred Lane. David Prondzinski moved to approve whichever name was available in Trempealeau County; Gerald Stellflug seconded and the motion carried.

There have been several stray dogs picked up in the last couple months. It is getting costly to dispose of them. The clerk/treasurer was directed to check into the policy at the new Trempealeau County Humane Society.

## **Building Issues –**

- ✓ The G-E-T Post Prom committee again made a request to the Town to donate the use of the building for their event on April 22, 2006. David Prondzinski moved to approve the request; Gerald Stellflug seconded and the motion carried.
- ✓ Gerald Stellflug commented on the stains on the carpet in the community room.
- ✓ Over the weekend during the bonspiel, the Trempealeau County Health inspector made a surprise inspection of the kitchen. There were minor incidents that the curling club needed to take care of.
- ✓ There have been several occasions when the flag should have been lowered to half staff. If anyone hears of an occasions when it needs to be done, let clerk know.

## **Correspondence –**

- ✓ Perrot Park invited the Board down for a noon lunch February 22, 23 or 24, whichever date would work best.
- ✓ The clerk/treasurer reported that in 2005 there were permits issued for 22 new homes, 5 additions and 12 accessory buildings.
- ✓ Notice of mining in the Harris Pit.
- ✓ Andrew Werden who lives on Grover Lane received notice to cleanup the junk cars on his property by February 10, 2006
- ✓ Riverland Energy would like town officials to contact their representatives on the high cost of transportation of coal.
- ✓ David Prondzinski had also spoke with Riverland Energy on checking into getting a grant for making Schubert Road an all seasons road due to the construction of the new UAP business.
- ✓ Each board member was given a handout on the Great River Road route and if we wanted it to remain the same. It will be put on the agenda for next month.
- ✓ Road bans will be put on when needed.
- ✓ On the Saturday, January 21 tax collection, the clerk/treasurer reported she had only 19 taxpayers and collected \$25,425.16.
- ✓ The residents of the G-E-T School District that live in Dodge will be voting here on February 21, 2006. The clerk from the Town of Dodge stated they would pay for one poll worker.
- ✓ The clerk/treasurer viewed several different handicap voting machines last week.
- ✓ The clerk/treasurer informed the board of the need for a new chief election inspector due to Holly Youngerberg moving out of the township.

The next meeting was set for March 9, 2006.

Gerald Stellflug moved to adjourn the meeting; David Prondzinski seconded and the motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 7:20 p.m.
