**MINUTES OF THE 3/09/2006  
REGULAR BOARD MEETING**

Chairman George Walski called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. All Board Members were present.

Open meeting certification laws were met. David Prondzinski moved to adopt the agenda, Gerald Stellflug seconded and the motion carried.

**Public Comments. –**

Mike Behan, representing the G-E-T Schools for the Future group, spoke in support the upcoming school referendum to exceed the revenue limit by \$800,000. Brochures were left for anyone who wanted one.

Bill Bulawa was wondering about the start date of the 11<sup>th</sup> street construction project and his driveway. He was told the Town would make his driveway accessible when completed with the project.

Gerald Stellflug moved to approve the minutes of the February 9, 2006 board meeting; David Prondzinski seconded and the motion carried.

Doris Dahl, Clerk/Treasurer reported a balance as of February 28, 2006 of \$279,620.49 in checking and \$70,000.45 in a regular savings account for a total of \$349,620.94.

Gerald Stellflug made a motion to pay STCSWC their payments on a semi-annual basis, David Prondzinski seconded and the motion carried. The Clerk/Treasurer will make the payment next month to catch up to the semi-annual amount.

The Board reviewed the vouchers for February 10, 2006 through March 9, 2006. Gerald Stellflug moved to pay the bills; David Prondzinski seconded and the motion carried.

**Building Permits**

Troy Rolbiecki presented a permit to build a new home on Lot 3, Prairie Bluffs Addition. Gerald Stellflug moved to approve; David Prondzinski seconded and the motion carried.

Jeff Kulas presented a permit to build a new home on Lot 19, Prairie Bluffs Addition. Gerald Stellflug moved to approve; David Prondzinski seconded and the motion carried.

Yvonne & Keith Wilson presented a permit to build a new home on Lot 38, Prairie Bluffs Addition. Gerald Stellflug moved to approve; David Prondzinski seconded and the motion carried.

Craig Gerlach, Superintendent of the G-E-T Schools, informed the Board on the reason for the operating referendum. A packet of information was handed out supporting the reasons.

Discussion was held on moving the furnace/air conditioning unit from the roof of the building to ground level. Whenever service is needed in the winter, Ziegler Heating & Air Conditioning expresses concerns about going up on the building to service it. Tom Bice spoke on behalf of the Curling Club. He suggested putting a working platform up there for easier access. He felt other obstacles were: plumbing changes would be needed, the supply and return air exchanger would be affected, electrical and the ductwork changes. The Board received a rough estimate to move it from Ziegler Heating and Air Conditioning in the amount of \$6000. The matter was tabled to do more research.

The Clerk/Treasurer made contact with the Trempealeau County Humane Society on the Dogs issue. They are not interested in taking the animal because the Town did not participate in the initial start up. They suggested we could be on their agenda to discuss this with them. It was the consensus to request to be placed on the agenda. This issue is tabled until after their meeting.

The Open Book and Board of Review meeting is set for May 9, 2006. Open book will be from 4:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. and Board of Review will be from 6:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m.

Gerald Stellpflug moved to send a letter to the Wisconsin Department of Transportation leaving the Scenic Byways program and route to remain the same in our township; David Prondzinski seconded and the motion carried.

David Prondzinski moved to approve the 2007 Highway Petition in the amount of \$70,000 and list Schuh Road and Bortle Road as the roads to be repaired; Gerald Stellpflug seconded and the motion carried.

A reminder of the Annual Meeting to be held Tuesday, April 11, 2006 at 7:00 p.m.

Discussion was held on purchasing or leasing a new mower for roadside mowing. The issue was tabled to gather more information.

Discussion was held on purchasing a trailer for hauling culverts, lawn mower and other items as needed. The consensus was to purchase a smaller trailer for hauling the lawn mower. This issue was table to check into options.

Discussion was held on purchasing a toolbox for the new ton truck. David Prondzinski moved to buy the biggest one possible that fits on the truck up to \$500; Gerald Stellpflug seconded and the motion carried.

- ✓ Gerald Stellpflug moved to pay back Flury's half of the cost of renting the community room on February 19, 2006; David Prondzinski seconded and the motion carried. The heat was out for several hours.
- ✓ The Red Cross is going to have another blood drive here April 7, 2006 from 10:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m.
- ✓ Discussion was held on redesigning the front entry steps and ramp. Reedy Concrete Construction will be contacted to come and give us ideas and costs.

- ✓ The Land Management Annual Meeting is rescheduled to March 30, 2006 at Pigeon Falls Town Hall starting at 7:30 p.m.

- ✓ Andrew Werden on Grover Lane was sent a warning from Trempealeau County Zoning Department regarding the junk on his property. He has until March 24, 2006 to comply.
