

**TOWN OF TREMPEALEAU  
ANNUAL MEETING  
APRIL 13, 2010**

The annual meeting was called to order by Chairman Wayne Wilber at 7:00 p.m. There were 9 people present, 8 residents and 1 non-resident.

The Clerk read the minutes of the last Annual Meeting held April 14, 2010. David Prondzinski moved to approve; Howard Hare seconded and the motion carried by voice vote.

Doris Dahl, Clerk/Treasurer read the Annual meeting report, reporting a balance as of December 31, 2009 of \$571,781.00 in the money market account, and \$458,898.00 in checking for a total of \$1,030,679.00. December tax collection of \$867,708.00 is included in the balance. Beginning balance for 2009 was \$432,841.00 in checking, \$534,159.00 in the money market account. Receipts for 2009 were \$2,185,180.00 and expenses for 2009 were \$2,121,501.00, leaving an ending balance of \$1,030,679.00. Ken Farley moved to approve; Colin Hirner seconded and the motion carried by voice vote.

The Clerk/Treasurer read a petition regarding County prospective roads for Bortle Road in the amount of \$46,728.00; Doug Winters moved to adopt; David Prondzinski seconded. Chairman Wilber explained a “yes” vote would approve the petition and “no” vote would disapprove the petition. Doug Winters and Ken Farley were appointed tellers. Ballots were cast and there were 8 “yes” and 0 “no” votes. The motion carried.

There were no additional requests from the local cemeteries.

Edye Hirner spoke on behalf of the Trempealeau Public Library, reviewing their budget and also the number of Town residents that used the library. She would like the Board to strongly reconsider increasing the budget consideration to the library back to \$5000. David Prondzinski moved to take an advisory vote on whether to increase the budgeted amount back to \$5000 fro 2011; Colin Hirner seconded. Doug Winters and Ken Farley will again be the tellers. A “yes” vote would be to increase the budget to \$5000 and a “no” vote would be to leave it where it is. There were 4 – no votes and 4 – yes votes. The board will take this under advisory when completing the budget next fall.

Dennis Bortle raised the question on what the members of the Board should be paid for. Most felt anytime a supervisor did town work, they should be paid for it. The clerk/treasurer was asked what the duties were for supervisors. She explained it is listed in the state statutes and would look it up. Wages were also discussed. No changes were made.

There being no further business to come before the Annual Meeting, Howard Hare moved to adjourn, Dave Prondzinski seconded and the motion carried by voice vote. The meeting was adjourned at 7:55 p.m.
